PRIVILEGES AS OUTLINED BELOW

I. DEPARTMENT OF MEDICINE

- A. The general field of Internal Medicine –
 - 1. Allergic Diseases –
 - 2. Arthritic Diseases
 - 3. Cardiac Diseases
 - 4. Dermatological Disorders
 - 5. Gastrointestinal Diseases
 - 6. Hematological Diseases
 - 7. Metabolic and Endocrine Disease
 - 8. Disturbances of water and electrolyte balance
 - 9. Convulsive Disorders
 - 10. Pulmonary Diseases

- B. Procedures:
 - 1. Electrocardiograms - initial interpretation (not written)
 - 2. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation
 - 3. Endotracheal intubation as necessary
 - 4. Thoracentesis
 - 5. Paracentesis
 - 6. Lumbar puncture
 - 7. Gastric lavage

II. DEPARTMENT OF SURGERY

General Surgery

- 1. Burns, first, second, and third degree
- 2. Incision and drainage (abscesses, paronychia, etc.)
- 3. Suture - uncomplicated wounds
- 4. Thoracentesis and tube thoracostomy
- 5. Removal of foreign body from eye, Rust Ring Removal
- 6. Treatment of non-displaced fractures with consultation with orthopedic surgeon
- 7. Anoscopy

8. Pilonidal cyst - incision and drainage
 9. Reduction of dislocation without fracture
 10. Posterior dislocation of shoulder, only with approval of attending physician
 11. Skeletal trauma not to include reduction of fractures except as above
 12. Peritoneal lavage for diagnostic purposes
 13. Nerve blocks and local anesthesia for primary repairs
 14. Epistaxis - packing anterior and posterior
 15. Laryngoscopy
 16. Other
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III. DEPARTMENT OF PEDIATRICS

- A. The general field of ambulatory pediatrics
- B. Emergency evaluation of all patients and life saving measures such as C.P.R.
- C. Minor Surgical Procedures
 1. Removal of foreign body in nose and ear
 2. Suture lacerations
 3. I & D Abscesses
 4. Spinal Tap - with patient's physician's approval or patient guardian's approval if patient has no physician
 5. Cut Down
 6. Paracentesis
 7. Pericardiocentesis if emergent

IV. DEPARTMENT OF OB-GYN

- A. Emergency evaluation of obstetrical patients, consultation with patient's physician
 1. The OB staff physician on call will be assistant to emergency precipitated deliveries
- B. Disorders of menstruation

V. DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHIATRY

Emergency evaluation of psychiatric patients, consultation with patient's physician.

VI. DEPARTMENT OF RADIOLOGY

Radiograms - initial interpretations (not written)

VII. DEPARTMENT OF ANESTHESIA

_____ Class 1 - Privileges granted to those physicians/providers to perform local infiltration anesthesia, topical application and minor nerve blocks without intravenous, intramuscular sedation and/or narcotics.

_____ Class 2 - Privileges assigned to physicians/providers who are qualified to perform anesthetic procedures under controlled conditions in addition to local infiltration, topical application, and minor nerve blocks to include conscious intravenous, intramuscular sedation and/or use of narcotics.
