Basic Education: M.D. or D.O.

Minimal Formal Training: Successful completion of an ACGME or AOA-approved residency program in internal medicine. Must be Board Eligible or Board Certified.

Required Experience: Demonstration of provision of inpatient services to at least 30 patients in the last 12 months.

Core Privileges: Ability to admit, work up, diagnose, and provide non-surgical treatment including consultation for patients over the age of 18. Care of patients with life-threatening illnesses including ICU privileges.

Other privileges requested for which you have current clinical competency may be listed below. Documentation of training and/or experience must be provided for any special privileges requested. Conscious Sedation <input data-bbox="211 478 274 520" type="checkbox"/>	Successful completion of an accredited residency of at least three year's duration. <i>Note: If the applicant's training did not include at least four weeks of anesthesia training (including IV sedation, indications, contra-indications, pre-anesthesia assessment, intra-operative care, procedure monitoring, and post-anesthesia care), the applicant must demonstrate successful completion of an accredited training sequence involving both didactic and practical components.</i>	Performance of IV sedation for at least 50 patients during the past eighteen months.	
Flexible sigmoidoscopy <input data-bbox="211 1318 274 1360" type="checkbox"/>	Successful completion of an accredited residency or fellowship in gastroenterology, colon and rectal surgery, GI surgery, or internal medicine. <i>Note: If the residency did not include training in flexible sigmoidoscopy, the applicant must demonstrate successful completion of 20 hours of Category I continuing medical education.</i>	Evidence of either of the following: At least 20 supervised procedures using the 60-cm sigmoidoscopy; or at least 10 supervised procedures using the 35-cm sigmoidoscope.	

<p>Gastrointestinal endoscopy</p>	<p>Successful completion of an accredited residency or fellowship in gastroenterology, gastrointestinal surgery, or colorectal surgery. <i>Note: If the residency or fellowship did not include training for each procedure requested, the applicant should be required to have completed hands-on training program for each procedure requested through a preceptorship or proctorship, under the supervision of an experienced endoscopist.</i></p>	<p>Evidence of the completion of the following during the last 12 months: Diagnostic EGD; at least 100 procedures; Total colonoscopy; at least 100 procedures; Snare polypectomy; at least 20 procedures; Nonvariceal hemostasis (upper and lower), including at least 10 active bleeders; at least 20 procedures; ERCP (therapeutic) at least 25 procedures; Tumor ablation; at least 20 procedures; Pneumatic dilation for achalasia; at least five procedures; and Esophageal stent emplacement; at least 10 procedures</p>	<p>Ongoing competence in each requested procedure demonstrated by the annual performance of the same number of procedures required for initial procedures; and successful completion of continuing medical education requirements that relate to gastrointestinal endoscopy.</p>
