Delineation of Core Privileges

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA: To be able to request these clinical privileges, the applicant must meet the criteria below:

1. **MD, DO**

2. **Completed additional education/training as follows:**

-Must be certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine in the subspecialty and/or subspecialties of Hematology and/or Medical Oncology; or,

NEW APPLICANTS MUST BE Board Eligible and complete Board Certification within 5 years of application/approved Medical Staff membership.

3. **Have the following past experience:**

-It is understood that physicians applying for **HEMATOLOGY/ONCOLOGY CORE** privileges are qualified to care for seriously ill medical patients with hematologic/oncologic problems.

4. **Be able to secure clinical references as outlined in the Policy On Appointment, Reappointment and Clinical Privileges of the Medical Staff of the Heart Hospital of New Mexico.**

HEMATOLOGY/ONCOLOGY CORE PRIVILEGES

Performance of Hematology/Oncology procedures (including related admission, consultation, work-up, pre-and postoperative care) to correct or treat various conditions and illnesses of the Hematologic System or Oncologic related problems.

A representative, but of necessity not complete list of **HEMATOLOGY/ONCOLOGY CORE** procedures is stated below. It is assumed that other procedures and problems of similar complexity will fall within the identified **HEMATOLOGY/ONCOLOGY CORE** privileges.

MINIMUM CRITERIA OF 20 (Combined) HEMATOLOGY/ONCOLOGY CORE PROCEDURES WITHIN TWO YEARS CAN BE FULFILLED FROM OTHER HOSPITAL AFFILIATIONS.

- Bone marrow biopsy
- Lumbar puncture
- Intrathecal chemo treatment
- Intra-cavitary chemo treatment
- Systemic chemotherapy
- Intra-arterial chemotherapy
- Cancer treatment planning
