Delineation of Core Privileges

1. **Eligibility Criteria:** To be able to request these clinical privileges, the applicant must meet the criteria below:

A. Basic Education: M.D. or D.O.

B. Successful completion of an approved ACGME residency training program in Urology.

NEW APPLICANTS MUST BE Board Eligible and complete Board Certification within 5 years of application/approved Medical Staff membership.

2. **Required Previous Experience**

The successful applicant must be able to demonstrate that he or she has performed at least fifty (50) urological procedures during the last twenty-four (24) months. That he or she has had a minimum of twelve (12) of the previous twenty-four (24) months in active practice of urology in either a residency or private practice setting.

3. **Be able to secure clinical references as outlined in the Policy On Appointment, Reappointment and Clinical Privileges of the Medical Staff of the Heart Hospital of New Mexico.**

4. **Core I Privileges in Urology**

Core I privileges include consultation, work up, diagnosis and the performance of medical treatment and surgical procedures on patients presenting with illness or injury to the genitourinary tract, including the genitalia, urinary tract, bladder, prostate, kidneys, and adrenal glands.
